As the name suggests, the EU Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) is a seven-year planning of the **common policy** in the agricultural sector, which is set out in four EU regulations. CAP is based on two pillars:

- Pillar I includes Direct income support and Common market organisation schemes
- ⊘ Pillar II concerns rural development







Main challenge for this chapter consists in setting out a **domestic policy** in the agriculture sector that begins to shape and look like the EU model







The implementation of the EU CAP requires an established and functional **infrastructure**, which needs its own domestic legislative framework. This infrastructure includes:

- Fully functional Paying Agency with sufficient and well trained staff to implement direct payments, common market organisation schemes and rural development measures
- Integrated Administration and Control System
- Farm Accountancy Data Network (Farm register)
- Land Parcel Identification System
- Farm Advisory System







So far, we have prepared and suggested a structure that reflects the **main building blocks** of the CAP, in order for the beneficiary to orient and plan its future work. These are, most importantly,:

- > The issue of the **direct payments** and the respective implementing agencies and infrastructure (mentioned above)
- > The horizontal mechanisms of the **Common Market Organisation (CMO)**:
 - Market interventions
 - Aid schemes
 - Marketing standards
 - Producers Organisation
 - Trade Policy
- > Rural Development
